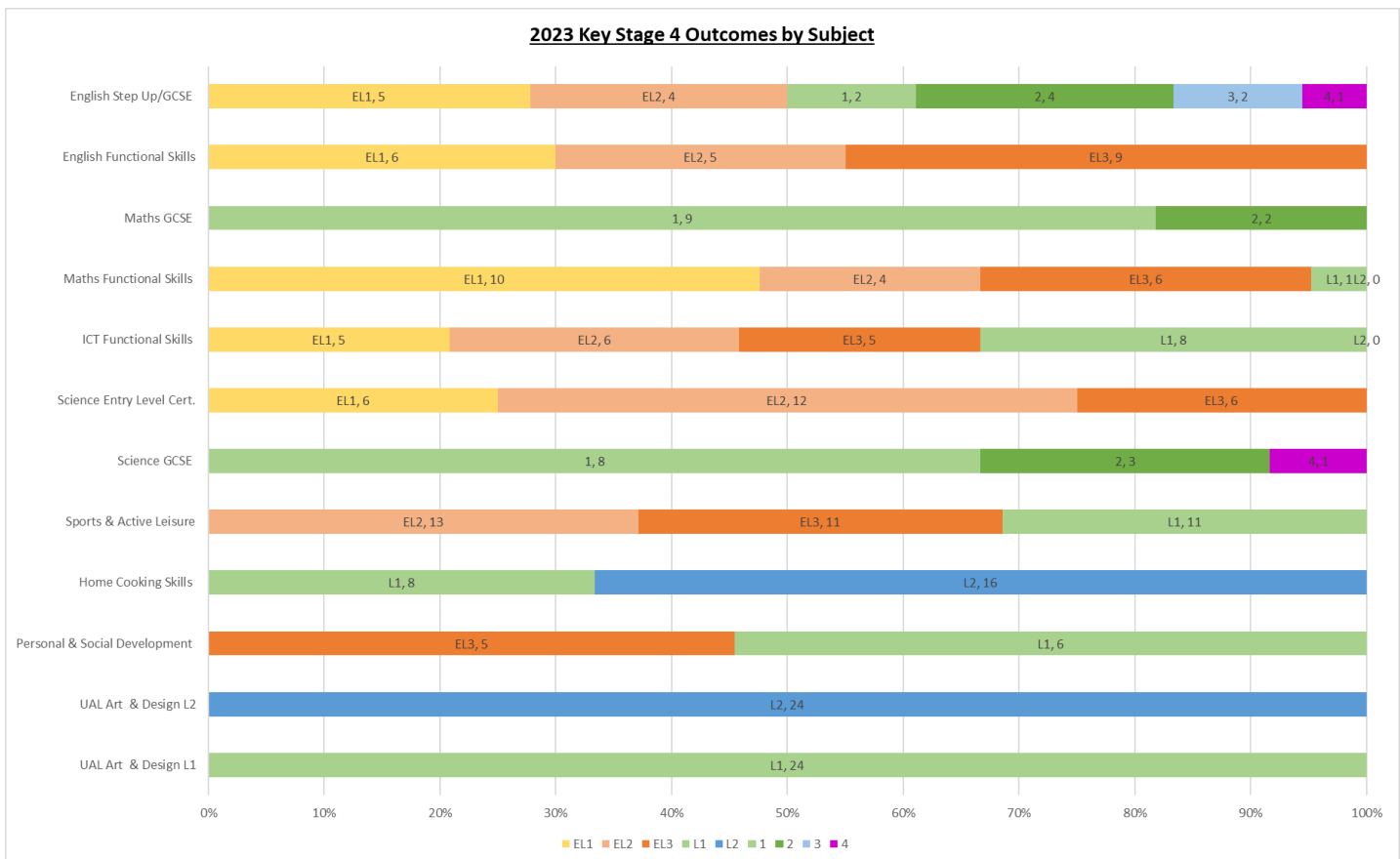
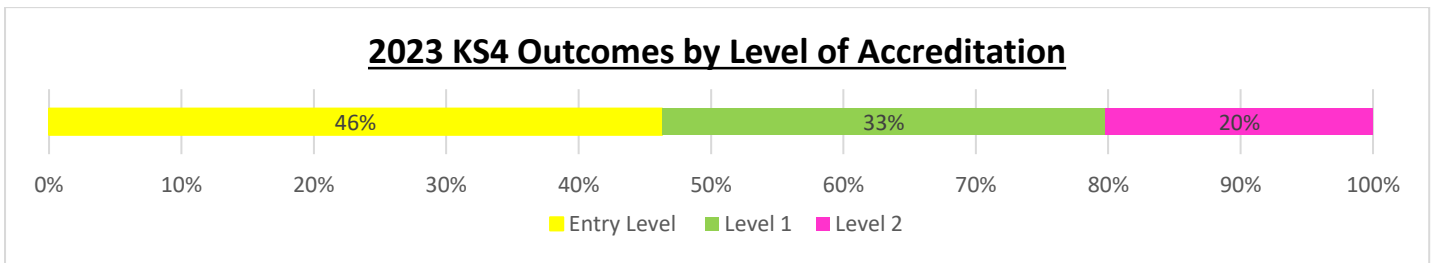


Key Stage 4 Accredited Outcomes Summary 2023

Summary:

- There were 24 students in this cohort, 22 of whom arrived at Year 7 secondary transfer
- Students achieved accreditation across a broad and balanced range of 9 accredited subjects plus smaller ASDAN courses in Beliefs & Values, Geography and History.
- 100% of students passed accreditation in ICT; Art; Design Technology; Food Technology; PE and Science.
- School self-evaluation is that these outcomes are consistent with the July 2018 Ofsted inspection judgment that ‘Pupils’ outcomes are excellent. They make strong progress from their starting points across a wide range of subjects because of highly effective teaching’.



Further Notes

This was the first year for EL and Level 1 Unit Awards in PE. This course went well and allowed students to do a lot more physical PE than in the previous BTEC which is no longer on offer.

This cohort had some students with higher than average starting points and as a result there were more GCSE results than in previous cohorts. 39% of GCSE grades were a 2, 3 or 4.

The results in Chemistry GCSE were at similar levels to results in English and Maths (English slightly higher, Maths slightly lower).

Approximately 94% of accreditation achieved by our students is 'discounted' from inclusion in the Progress 8 and Achievement 8 measures. Although these measures may be useful for comparing mainstream schools, they do not provide useful data in our context due to this discounting and the lack of reliable baseline data.
